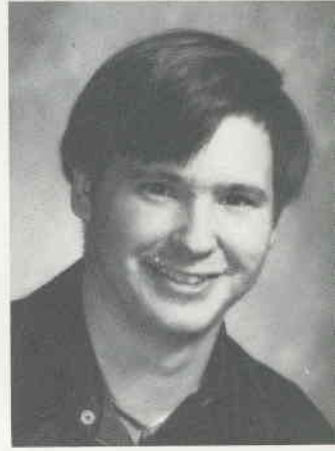
"Wanna get married?" This ques-
