Writing letters is also on some

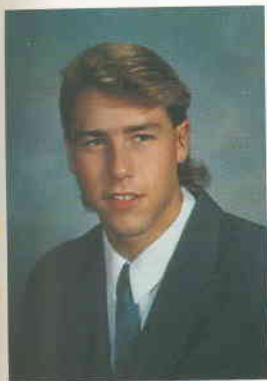
seniors' minds as a way of keeping in touch.
