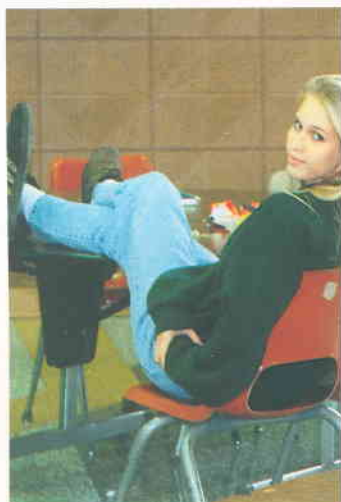


Lunch time is as good as any time to sit back and relax. Senior Jessica Briggs feels right at home.

"I really grew up and opened myself to others and their opinions," said Senior Chris Hart.

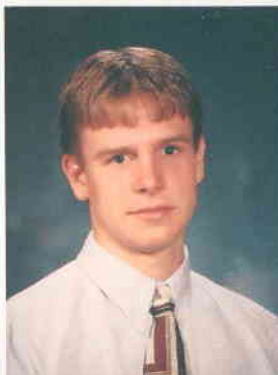
As the high school years roll by, classes change as well as friends and attitudes.
