I attended Union Home Elementary School through the eighth grade and then rode the bus to Rodney B. Wilson High School. Following graduation, I attended CMU.



I have attended church regularly since childhood and became a Christian at an early age. That's where I met my husband, Dennis Phillips. I held many position in the church including treasurer. Following my marriage, I began working at MSU until just prior to the birth of our first child after which I became a stay-at-home mom. I didn't start regularly working away from home until later, including being the bookkeeper for our orchard and retail businesses. I worked many places, but retired from Clinton County in 2018 following my husband's diagnosis of Alzheimer's.
