



Brian Grennell


Brian Grennell was born in St. Johns in 1964 and grew up in the St. Johns area. His lineage through both of his parents traces back several generations in Clinton County. He has served on the Advisory committee for the CCHS Museum/Paine-Gillam-Scott Museum in St. Johns Michigan since 2007.



Brian became interested in local history and genealogy at a young age, which guided his college and career paths. He attended Michigan State University, earning both a B.A. and M.A. with specialization in historic preservation. He worked for 24 years for the State Historic Preservation Office and currently works as a Historian for the Michigan Department of Transportation, where he conducts reviews under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 to consider the impacts of federally funded projects on historic and archaeological resources. Brian and his wife Jodi have been married for 25 years and reside in Lansing.

A number of improvements have been underway at the museum.

Volunteers Chuck Peters and Larry Hayner removed the old concrete steps and railing at the General Store



entrance which had become unsafe and replaced them with a new wooden deck and beautiful side rails.

With the assistance of volunteer Jim Parr, the museum has had several technology improvements including a faster Internet and the soon to be launched online version of the museum Past Perfect cataloging software.

The museum misses the contributions of two longtime volunteers in the passing of Ron Matson and the resignation of Judy Hubler. They were both important in the organization, cataloging, and assessment of museum documents and artifacts. We are grateful that Jim Parr has stepped in to help fill the void from their loss.

The museum is enjoying a much more robust season of visitors this year. The Rodney B. Wilson High School exhibit has brought in lots of folks to check out all the memorabilia we have displayed from 1925-1969. Additionally, opening the museum on Saturday mornings instead of Sunday afternoons has increased our visitor at the door significantly. The Saturday mornings will end on October 25th which will coincide with our Christmas Holiday preparations.
