GREENBUSH UNITED METHODIST CHURCH LISTED IN STATE REGISTER

The Greenbush United Methodist Church, a rectangular, crossgable- roofed wooden building has been listed in the State Register of Historic Places.

The church, with a corner, jugshaped open belfry topped by a soaring pyramidal roof, rests on a fieldstone foundation. It has lancet-shaped entrance pavaillion, pointed arch window enframements, with arched, recessed dormers punctuating its' belfry.

The church has historical significance as it is the oldest Methodist congregation in central Clinton County.

It's history dates to 1849 when Rev. William Benson of Rochester Colony organized a class of 7 people. That nucleus became the congregation. Services were held in various log buidings.

In May 1895 following a "great revival" preached by James Connolly, agitation began for a church building.

## In The News

#### CLINTON HOME CENTER BURNS HISTORIC BUILDING LOST

(Excerpted from Clinton County News of 2/10/87)

"Flames shot high into the sky (on 2/7/87) and lighted up downtown St. Johns Saturday night as six fire departments battled a blaze that completely destroyed the Clinton Home Center at 108 E. Railroad St."

Thousands of residents, some with "cameras or video recorders, lined downtown streets...to witness the biggest fire disaster in St. Johns since the ... Steel Hotel" burned in 1975.

Greg Penix, owner, said he had closed the store about 4 p.m.

The state fire marshall's office investigated and said the blaze began in the center of the building but cause was not determined. Arson was ruled out.

The 12,000 square foot building housed St. Johns' main livery stables at the turn of the century. The sprawling building later became a distribution center for mint oil produced by area farmers.

The building has been owned by the Penix family for about 25 years.

Within the next 2 years church members purchased the Grange building and added land for church sheds. Henry Hewitt, a Maple Rapids carpenter, drafted plans. Completed at a cost of just under \$4,000, the frame and fieldstone church was dedicated for worship on Aug. 28, 1898.

The church is at the corner of Scott and Marshall Roads in Greenbush Township about 5 miles northeast of St. Johns.

#### CLINTON FLAG REDISCOVERED

their January 27, 1987 Clinton County Board of Commissioner meeting, outly officials displayed a county flag none knew existed. It had been in the basement of the courthouse for 46 years.

The 5 by 8 foot silk flag was fished from a storage room by Roy Spicer, county buildings maintenance supervisor. He said he knew it was there, packed with flags the county uses for special occasions. But he never knew its' meaning.

Spicer got it out after Geneva Wiskemann, chairwoman of the county board's Historical Commission, asked about it.

She said every county had a glag vien them by the J. L. Hudson store in Detroit. She had read about it in a book titled, "Special Flags of Michigan Counties." It was a limited edition that told the story about how Hudson's had silk flags made for every county in the state in 1940.

Wiskemann said the firm enjoyed a reputation for its contributions to Michigan art. When the flag exhibit closed the store gave each county its' flag.

Clinton's is a multi-colored flag and it sparked interest because, along with the word "CLINTON" in the center, was a spray of mint leaves.

Several years ago the St. Johns Area Chamber of Commerce began an annual Mint Festival and the crop, which declined in the early 1900's, is making ome-back.

Also on display in the commissioners room is a new Sesquicentennial flag denoting the state's year-long Sesquicentennial celebration this year.
