IN THE NEWS: MICHIGAN ORAL HISTORY COUNCIL PLANS CONFERENCE

The Michigan Oral History Council welcomes oral historians everywhere to "Oral History for Michiganians, A Conference - Oct, 2-3" at the Sheraton, Lansing.

The official state Sesquicentennial event is funded in part by grants from the Michigan Department of Commerce and the Michigan Council for the Humanities. It is receiving support from other organizations too.

Donald A. Ritchie, national Oral History Association president, will highlight the program with an address: "When Does an Interview Become Oral History." Alferdteen Harrison, director of the Institute for the Study of History, Life and Culture of Black People, Jackson State University, will speak on the "Uses of Oral History to Interpret Black Culture."

The program begins Friday morning with workshops on oral history, storytelling, folklore, and poetry.

Conference sessions also include the Upper Peninsula, experience in oral history for genealogists and community historians; projects conducted at Michigan State University; interviewing prominant people Michigan pioneers as oral historians; oral history from a lawyer's point of view; and as a research tool for recording and preserving history and romance of "planes, trains and weathervanes."

Those arriving Thursday night will be treated to "A Stone Circle Chautauqua: Salute Michigan."
