MUSUEM Seeks Endowment Fund

The Paine-Gillam-Scott MUSEUM, housed in the oldest brick house in St. Johns, built in 1860, has been restored as a "HOUSE MUSEUM" portraying family life. Upstairs are exhibits of Clinton County history and events of times past and present.

The building and lot on which it stands is owned by the County but leased, September 1, 1978, to the Clinton County Historical Society for one dollar a year. Neither, the County or the City, aids in the financial support of the Museum. The MUSEUM is supported ONLY from donations, memorials and remembrances through bequests in wills.

The restoration, establishment, management, education, maintenance and support have all been accomplished through the efforts of some beautiful and generous people of Clinton County---ALL VOLUNTEERS.

Our growth in the past ten years has broughtus to a point where professional help is going to be required. In January of 1984, the Historical Society set up an ENDOWMENT FUND to acquire a base upon which the MUSEUM would eventually be able to support such leadership on the interest earned.

No financial drive has ever been made for this fund and in the very near future you may receive a letter, please read and consider.

We trust this presents a C A U S E for history-minded and philanthropic individuals that wish for the continuance of a MUSEUM. As this fund grows the interest can aid in its "Purpose: The Preservation of a MUSEUM."
