Submissions should fellow the same form so they can be copied for the Index. You may submitany name on which you have genealogica information or for which you wish to seek anv infermation.

Identify each card submitted for the INDEX with your name, address, and current date so that inquiries may be easily referred. You need not be concerned that seme cards are incomplete. Doubtful or appreximate dates, names etc. can be labled with a ? question mark. er ether missing data indicates that you are requesting help and semeene may be able to give it to you.

A Surname INDEX will be published periedically. The INDEX will be available at the Clinton County Historical Museum, with cepies at the Bement Library and the State Library, as well as Mid-Michigan Genealegical Seciety. The of the greatest values of the file will be its incorporation in a publication by the Genealegy Secieties and the Michigan Genealegy Seciety. Much wide distrubution of these indices is possible and they are picked up by the various wuery publicatiens.
