800 visit Paine-Gillam-Scott House during 1979 Christmas season

Christmas visitors to the Paine-Gillam-Scott House Museum totaled 800 by the final day of the holiday season, Sunday, Jan. 6. Decorations and exhibits were in keeping with the Victorian remodeling of the home.

Now visitors will find Riley Township in the township room; an exhibit of guns and swords in the upstairs display case and antique valentines in the front room. Catherine Rumbaugh reported that Arleen Schrader is in charge of the Riley Township exhibit and has arranged a display of wedding dresses dating back 25, 50, 75 and 100 years. The collection will remain through April. (DeWitt township is next.) The guns and swords are from the interesting collection of Bill Bennent's.

Scott and Judy Croisant's Victorian doll house will remain until the first part of __february as will Martha Foust's Chinese Brass collection that is in the dining room.

The staff at the Alpena Museum has sent some lovely small items to us after hearing about our new museum at the recent conference in Lansing. An old school sutograph album with dates back to 1885, a commencement exercise program from 1889 and a program announcing the rehersal for "Ye Towne Singers" dated 1889, were included in the envelope from Alpena.

Three nice gifts were made to the museum from the Watertown Township exhibit. For our permanent collection are a lovely oil lamp, a ladder back chair that was made as a rocker and then remodeled for a chair and a very interesting old picture from World War I.

Speaking of gifts, have you noticed the \$1,000 donor plaque at the museum? It is stationed in the front hall. Made from a beautiful piece of walnut which was originally the top of an old pump organ, the plaque announces: The Paine-Gillam-Scott House Museum Gift, \$1,000 donors.

It will include the names of benefactors whose gifts of both cash or items totals \$1,000. At present it lists: 1976: J. Hubbard Snyder estate; 1977: Henry and Allie Sperkert estate; 1979, Burton Abstract and Title Co., Treva Merrill Smith, Manning and Hila Bross, and Leona Stockwell Rumbaugh.

In November the museum staff had a restoration session that resulted in removing the cement covering from the kitchen floor and the plaster from a kitchen wall that revealed the original fireplace. Mrs. Rumbaugh said that it is believed that the fireplace was enclosed and the cement floor laid between 1910 and 1920. The random width pine flooring found under the cement floor is believed original to the 1867 kitchen addition on the home. The fireplace appears to be one made just for heating but it could have been used for cooking if coals were pulled out onto the hearth and used under iron spiders.

Renovation will resume again now that the Christmas season is over. Work will center on the kitchen and back hall again according to Mrs. Rumbaugh. "We have to do some research to decide how to restore the fireplace," she said. The crew is sure there was no mantel but think there may have been a shelf at eye level. "We don't know if plaster was put over the brick, or perhaps a pine board went around the fireplace," she indicated. The museum staff will research kitchens of the era before they determine what steps to take.
