Museum to celebrate Magnolia Blossom Wee

Magnolia Blossom Week starts Sunday, May 4 at the Paine-Gillam-Scott Musuem on Maple Street. St. Johns, planned to coincide with the flowering of the large and showy Magnolia tree on the south lawn of the museum. Each year the tree offers spectacular pink blossoms. It is the fines specimen in the city.

The celebration will open with an art exhibit featuring the works of Clinton County artists. The museum will go back to summer hours the first of May. The doors will be open on Sundays from noon until 4 p.m.; Wednesdays from 1:30 - 5 p.m. and Friday evening 7 to 9.


program on trails and roads of Clinton County.
