A reproduction Victorian doll house is on display upstairs and the Township Room has been emptied to allow for the over flow of Victorian toys and other holiday related items from the museum's collection.

Wednesday evenings are made special with Christmas music and a unique demonstration of a popular Victorian toy, "the Magic Lantern." The toy is a slide projector operated with an oil lamp. The slides are hand painted scenes on glass. "The Magic Lantern" was made from 1890 to 1910.

If you haven't been to the museum for awhile you are in for some surprizes. The kitchen restoration is nearly complete. The cupboards have been stripped and repainted and the fire-place has been refurbished. The new wallpaper is in the same brick red and tan colors found on the original wall paper discovered under the woodwork.
