AT PAINE - GILLAM - SCOTT MUSEUM

The Christmas spotlight in Clinton County this month is on Paine-Gillam-Scott where a Victorian-styled Christmas will be celebrated from Dec. 3 through Jan.4.

The season begins with the museum showing off its Christmas finery Dec. 3 when it participates in our annual home tour from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Included in the special exhibits will be a collection of turn-of-the century doll-house toys and we will be showing off an old time light post and lantern which were recently donated to us. Co-director Catherine Rumbaugh said original ownership of the light and post is still unknown but "it is nice to assume that it was one of the lightposts that were once used in St. Johns."

As is traditional, the Christmas tree was hauled from a nearby swamp and special "Candlelight with Music" programs will be held on Wednesday evenings.

Included in the museum's view of Christmas past will be a one horse cutter, cow and stag pitchers, antique dolls and doll houses and an American Flyer Train in demonstration.

THEY CAME TO CLINTON COUNTY MICH.

GEORGE W. WAITE OF ST. JOHNS, MICH.

George W. Waite, was the son of David Harrison Waite and Catherine Eaman Waite. David settled in Putnam Township, Livingston Co. in 1839 and also was married that same year. David purchased land in 1841 in that township. His son George W. Waite was born in 1842. George purchased 13 acres of land from his uncle Benjamin Waite in Scio Township, he enlisted in the Civil War in 1862. In 1866 he married Frances Watkins, then in 1874 in St. Johns he married the sister of his partner, Robert Whedon, Physician. Together they had a drug store in St. Johns.

Note: Gerda B. Schairer of Ann Arbor, MI. has old photos from a descendant of George W. Waite unfortunately, there are no names or identity. Quiz Answer

"Twas the night before Christmas when all through the house Not a creature was stirring, Not even a mouse..."

On Christmas Eve in 1822 Clement Clarke Moore, then a professor of religion at the diocesan seminary in New York, presented to his six chidren a most unusual holiday gift...a poem he had composed earlier that day on a sleigh trip downtown to Jefferson Market to buy the familys' Christmas turkey.

Through the years this ballad of 56 lines has become the most popular of American Christmas poems.

The next year a family friend took a copy of the poem to the editor of the Troy Sentenel and he published it anonymously on Dec. 23, 1823. The author remained anonymous until 1837 when it was included along with several other poems by Moore in an anthology, "The New-York Book of Poetry."

Moore was born in 1779 in Chelsea House, the family estate. He died in 1863 and every year on Christmas Eve the parishioners of Trinity Church make a pilgrimage to his grave, the church cemetery on upper Broadway to lay a winter
