Orrin & Luvina Wilson were honored during Black History Month by Elissa Slotkin, Rep. of the 7th Michigan Congressional District, when she read their biography into The Congressional Record on Feb. 7, 2024. Early Settler Certificates

VOLUNTEERS are vital to our existence. Rowlan Smith has volunteered at the Archives for over 17 years.

Lately he has been verifying data submitted by a family historian who has applied for eleven Early Settler Certificates.

To qualify for an Early Settler Certificate the applicant must directly descend from an ancestor who settled in Clinton County prior to 31 December 1865. You can download the application form on the <u>CCHS website</u>.

On Feb. 28, CCHS members and local officials gathered at the depot in St. Johns to commemorate the exact day 50 years ago when the founders of the society met to organize and prepare Clinton County for America's bicentennial celebration of 1976.

Kelly Jurman welcomed those attending and introduced Jeremy Blatt. He offered anniversary congratulations and read the Wilson biography which had recently been entered into *The Congressional Record*. Lynne Gregory, President of the CCHS, gave a brief history of the organization, and Jan Seperic recalled that the idea of a historical society was first explored during a meeting at her house.

The Museum had an exhibit that included a trunk of Dr. Gillam's. Alice Murphy displayed her assembly of many newspaper articles of the society's early days. Birthday cake, an array of cookies, and punch was enjoyed by the approximately 65 people present. Thanks to all who helped make this event a success.

Dedicated on October 1, 2022, it was built by metal artist, Ivan Iler, and underwritten by the children of William and Rosemary (Eaton) McCarthy.
