LEBANON FARMER'S CLUB Secretary's Book 1896-1899

A book containing minutes and lists of members of the Lebanon Farmer's Club about 100 years ago was recently acquired by the Archives. One page is reproduced below.

Du December meeting of the Lebanon Farmer's Club was held of the house of Mas of Mas H. Winging and approval of the minutes of the last meeting. Polones while "Making Farm life Engayable."

The minutes reveal that at most meetings a "paper" was presented and then discussion was held on its topic. Music, recitations, dinners, and other entertainment was also devised.

On Apr. 1, 1897, the membership of 46 resolved that the mortgage tax law was an unjust measure and that they were decidedly opposed to it.

At the next meeting on May 6, the topic was System in Housekeeping. Mrs. Mrs. Jay Sessions stated, "If order is the first law of heaven, it is or should be in every well regulated home. Have a system for your work. Do certain things on certain days or at certain times of the day. Women are, as a rule, slow to adopt new facilities for doing their work and are, therefore, more or less to blame for their condition for generally the husband is willing to provide for her comfort so far as he is able. Women should strive to be cheerful at all times, as that adds largely to the happiness of the home."

Another paper at that meeting was presented by Lewis Bently, and was titled, Corn Culture. Mr. Bently advised, "Sod ground should be used. Plow 3 or 4 inches deep as shallow plowing will hold the moisture. Roll the ground smooth, harrow well, mark both ways. When the corn is coming up, put a spoonful of ashes to each hill to kill cut worms."

County organization was the issue on Feb. 2, 1899. "The Lebanon Farmer's Club is not in favor of a county organization" was the resolution recorded. On Dec 2. 1898, after discussing the possibility of adding the 9th grade to the country schools, the majority stated they were not in favor of that.

At other meetings club members discussed child rearing, insurance, temperance, women' suffrage, and farm legislation. Genealogists will appreciate that many names are mentioned in this little treasure of a book.

DE WITT SCHOOL ALUMNI

FAMILY HISTORIES

CLARENCE J. AND MINA MC CUNE

At the top of the hill that is now a part of Solon Road of DeWitt Twp. there is an old house, presently unoccupied, but owned by Rae Gene Frederickson, a great granddaughter of Clarence and Mina McCune. The McCunes originally came from the town of Allegan. In 1913 they purchased the original 40 acres from a Mr. & Mrs. Robinson and moved into the old log house on the premises. It had two stories but no covering of any kind on the inside of the logs. It had been chinked up with plaster on the outside.

The log barn, even more dilapidated than the house, stood just at the rise of the hill where the buggy trail that connected them to the main road, now Turner St., ended. Turner ran from Lansing to DeWitt before US 27 was ever heard of. Below that hill a railroad track cut the farm in two parts, sort of dividing the hilly part on the west half from the swampy part to the east. Interurban trolley cars traveled back and forth from Jackson to St. Johns daily at certain specified times. In my high school days that was my mode of travel to and from school. Sometime in the 1930's it was discontinued.

East of this railroad track there was another hill, very high hill, much higher than the one on which the house and barn stood. In 1920, when US 27 was begun, the McCunes sold the dirt from their part of the hill to build this part of the highway. What a time they had just at the southeast corner of the farm. The

heavy fill dirt just squashed out the black mud and turned a spot several rods across upside down. (I have been told that this area was the site of a lake several years ago.) That same thing happened again in 1933 or 1934 when the pavement was widened and the other half of the hill was used. Originally the north half of the hill was a gravel pit owned by the Michigan Railroad Co. When the road (US 27) was first being built, a prison gang was housed by the gravel pit area for labor on the road. I was ten at the time, and as the men carried water from our well for camp use I enjoyed watching them. One of them gave me a handbag he had made in prison. I guess now I would be a little afraid but had no fears then.

The McCune family grew and grew. They gave me, their eldest daughter, a large lot on the northeast corner of the farm for a wedding present. My husband and I live here to this day. Later my father sold lots along the south side of Solon Road and, in fact, built three of the houses. Solon Road was a gift from him to the county to make sure a road would be built there.

The old log house and barn have long since been torn down. In 1916 my father and his father built the house at the top of the hill where the rest of his seven children were born and raised. They managed to eke out a living on those hills, he working part time at the Reo Motor Car Co. Later he quit the shop and raised cows to supplement his income.

My father was a great believer in education and went without many of the necessities of life to make sure his children got as good an education as they wanted. Tuition for secondary schools was high back then.

Yes, the McCune family grew and grew and now numbers very close to 200 not counting any spouses or step-children. Mr. McCune lived to well over 93; his first wife, my mother, predeceased him by 22 years. I believe he was a good solid citizen of Clinton Co., and more specifically the township of DeWitt. But, of course, I'm prejudiced.

VIRGIL AND MILDRED M. SAMPLE

By Mildred M. Sample My husband, Virgil Sample, originally from Evart, MI, and I have lived here at 1001 Solon Road, DeWitt, MI, since long before Solon Rd. was named or the houses numbered. We were given this lot on the northeast corner of their farm by my parents, Clarence and Mina McCune in 1929 as a wedding present. The following January we moved into a tiny house, new and unpainted. There was no well at first and no electricity until 1941. All five of our children were born there. After ten years we tore down the little house and built a larger, little more modern house in 1940.

The children and I all attended the Hurd School, District #9, of Clinton Co. and the DeWitt Schools for many years. Now, all the children are grown and have families of their own. They are the parents of our 24 grandchildren who, in turn, became the parents of 45 more. There is even a great, great grandson who lives in Harrison, MI.

Most of our large family have spent their lives thus far in and near DeWitt. Our two sons, as well as seven of our grandsons and one granddaughter are now, or were, in the U.S. Navy or the U.S. Marines. Some of the grandsons are at present non-commissioned officers.

Our first daughter, June Minier, and her husband, Raymond, lived in the DeWitt area and in St. Johns for many years. At retirement they made their cottage at Chippewa Lake into a larger, permanent home. June retired from the Michigan Department of treasury as an office supervisor in Individual Income Tax in May of 1990. Raymond retired in Sept. of 1989 as highway foreman on state highways in Clinton Co.

Our first son, Gene, and his wife, Marilyn, both retired in Apr. of 1992 from Michigan Department of Labor, he with fifteen years of service in the Bureau of Safety and Regulations as Safety Supervisor, and Marilyn as Secretary to the Director of Labor, with 31 years of service. They are building a house on a mountain in North Carolina at a place called Maggie Valley.

Our second daughter, Evalle Church, was content to be a housewife and grandmother to six lively ones. Her husband, Clayton, retired from his position as warehouse supervisor at the Michigan Military Establishment in April of 1987. They have lived here on Solon Road for forty years.

Lyle "Cork," our second son, is at present manufacturing coordinator at the Lansing Car Assembly, Division L.A.D. of General Motors. He has worked there for 39 Years. His wife, Lorraine, is head cashier at Cedarway Shell Oil Co. in Mason, MI. They will both retire in a year or so and make their home in Punta Gorda, FL.
