

#### **HEWITT-VAN VELZOR**

John VanVelzor was the first ancestor in America, emigrating from Holland ca1800, to Westchester County, New York. His son Elisha was born in 1791 on Van Courtlandt Manor in New York. He married Elizabeth Barrett. They had three children, Jefferson, Charity and Reuben (b. 3 Jun 1822- d.1908) in Allegheny Co., New York.

In 1844 Reuben married Saphronia Case (b. 24 Jun 1818-d.1901). They moved to Michigan and homesteaded a farm in Victor Township, section 20 on Alward Road in Clinton Co., which is presently owned by Barbara VanVelsor. Reuben & Saphronia had 6 children: Josephine, Carrie, William, Ona and Frank.

William VanVelsor (only branch of the family to spell his name with an "s".) was born on 2 Nov. 1852. He married Eleanor Conway (b. 23 Sep 1860) on December 20, 1886. They had 5 children: Ray, Roy, Luella, Lila and Edna.

Roy VanVelsor was born on 20 Jul 1889 in St. Johns where his father operated a grocery store on Clinton Avenue. He married **Birdella Stichler Chadwick** (b. 11 Feb 1887) on 9 Feb 1921.

#### MERRITT TEMPLE

#### **PERRY-OBERLA**

Abram Perry and his wife, Emily (Emma) Guyer, daughter of Frederic and Mary Bacon Gier, purchased 40 acres in Lebanon Township for \$400 from Barbara Balcom, April 23, 1859. The fact, unusual at the time, that Emily was also a purchaser, may be an indication that Abram was already suffering from consumption that killed him at the age of 28 in 1860 and he was providing for Emma and their children. Abram was buried in the Beach Cemetery beside an infant son, Francis, who died in 1855. Emma was left with a son, Henry Franklin (Frank) b. 1855 - d. 1930) and a daughter Sarah (Nettie) b. 1857.

In 1864, Emma married Barnhart Oberla (Barney Oberley) of Duplain Township. His first wife, Roxanna, had died in 1861 leaving him with three children: Albert, Russella (Della), and Alfonso. Barnhart was born in Saverque, France, and was a veteran of the Mexican War (Co. G, 15 Reg. Inf.) and the Civil War (Co. D, 1st Mich. Cav.). The Oberla's lived in Duplain Township until moving to Wayland Township of Allegan County. Children born to this marriage were: Freddy (died as infant), Alice E., Caroline, and Jay, all of whom lived in the Middleville/Wayland area.

Henry Franklin Perry married Jessie Sarah Gott of Jackson County in 1878. They lived in Duplain Township until moving to Greenbush Township. Their children were John M. who married Bessie Kidney and lived in Irving, Barry County; Ray Abram who married Ocie Miller and lived in St. Johns; and Gladys Emma who married Ralph Silvernail and lived in Greeenbush Township. (Nettie) Sarah married William Corson and lived in Middleville, Barry County.

# SAMUEL DEXTER

Judge Samuel W. Dexter, for whom Dexter Trail in Clinton Co. is named, built a home 1843-45 near Dexter, MI, naming it Gordon Hall. Today the building and surrounding property is owned by the University of Michigan. To facilitate its preservation, the university currently is petitioning the Washtenaw Co. Historic District Commission to designate the house and site as a historic district. The building was listed on the state and national registers in 1958 and 1972, respectively.

The Clinton Co. Archives has been given a copy of the final report of the Historical District Study Committee. It includes, not only a detailed description and history of Gordon Hall, but also extensive biographical information on **Samuel Dexter** and his family. It recounts of the death from scarlet fever in 1833 of Dexter's 2-year-old son, **Riley**, which occurred as the Dexter colonizing party (about eight or nine families from New York) crossed Clinton County blazing a trail to Ionia. Riley was buried along the trail in Bengal Township. He was the first white child buried in Clinton Co.

According to this report, Samuel Dexter:

- Was the first Chief Justice of Washtenaw County
- Was a University of Michigan Regent
- Was publisher of first Washtenaw County Newspaper
- Was involved with the Underground Railroad
- Was an outspoken abolitionist
- Hosted Presidents Polk and Buchanan at Gordon Hall
- Is regarded as founder of Ionia
- Platted Ionia and Saginaw
- Established the Village of Byron, Shiawassee Co.

# Clinton has Failed to Reach Waste Fat Quotas

Clinton-County Republican-News; 26 Apr. 1945; p4

During the 23 months that the fat salvage program has been in operation in Clinton County, we have reached our quota only once, according to a report issued this week by Dr. B. L. Bates, county salvage chairman. Dr. Bates' report appears below:

"In the hope that our citizens may be stimulated in their efforts to save more waste kitchen fats, the Clinton County Salvage Committee presents the following facts which show how it stands with the other 82 counties of the state. The record extends from April, 1943, to March, 1945. The figures are furnished by the rendering companies which collect the salvage from the grocers and butchers.

"The State Salvage Committee assigned us a quota of 3,500 pounds per month which has been reached only once during the 23 months—in May, 1943. Just how the quota was established is immaterial. The fact that an average of 23% of the counties do make their quotas each month shows that the figure is not far wrong. In only eight of these months have we been above the state's average.

"On the face of it, Clinton's records

looks bad, especially since we have made such a fine showing in the salvage of metal, paper, used clothing, stockings, and tin cans. Examination shows, however, that much of the fat salvage is turned in to cities lying just outside our boundaries—Hubbardston, Pewamo, Portland, Grand Ledge, Lansing, and Laingsburg—with only two of our cities drawing from out the county, Elsie and Ovid. In spite of this handicap, Clinton has sent 56,377 pounds of fats from our own stores since April, 1943, even though our monthly average is 1,355 pounds short of our quota...

"The irony of the situation is that now with meats scarcer than ever, our government is calling for more and more waste fats. In order that our fighting lads may not run short of ammunition, we must save every drop. Clinton turned in 3,444 pounds in Feb. or 90% of its quota. This was our best report in months. Can we do better?

"And don't forget, your grocer expects you to return every tin can you take from his store. Paper Trooper collections in the schools are exceeding predictions. Final pickup for the school year now in progress and complete reports will be soon be published."
