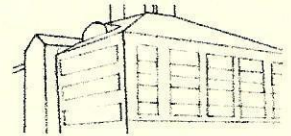

DOCTORS

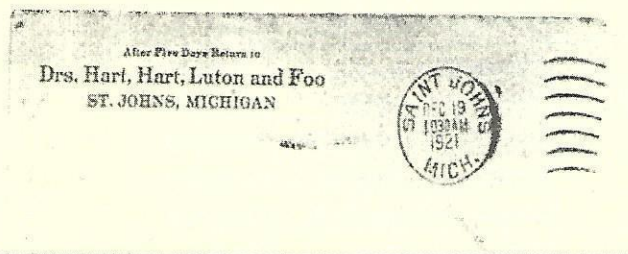
Dr. R. H. Sanborn, of Maple Rapids, has practiced medicine more years than any other physician in Clinton County. The doctor is now sixty-two years of age and still attends to the duties of his profession. He is passed in point of age by Dr. William Havens of St. Johns who is in his seventieth year and who has practiced medicine for thirty-five years. Dr. Dryer of Bath follows Dr. Sanborn in number of years of practice, having but three years less to his credit. Dr. Dryer is still as active as ever and retains a good practice and is a successful physician.

Dr. G. E. Corbin of St. Johns has the greatest number of years to his credit, having practiced for forty-five years, but his business has been largely confined to dental surgery and for many years he has declined to answer calls or to actively engage in the practice of medicine.

Under the new law the supervisors of the county have to file a list of the physicians in their township, giving their age and number of years practiced. From this list, which has just been made complete by County Clerk Smith, it is found that there are forty-four physicians in the county. Thirty of the number have complied with the law relative to filing their certificates with the county clerk so that, technically, but thirty doctors out of the forty-four are entitled to legally practice. It is, no doubt, an oversight on the part of the doctors who have neglected to have their papers properly entered at the clerk's office. In the list on record appear the names of the following physicians:

MEDICAL MEN OF CLINTON COUNTY

Many of the following details on early medical practitioners of Clinton County are edited from *Medical History of Michigan (MHM)*, in two volumes, compiled by the Michigan State Medical Society. The rest were taken from the local newspapers.

DR. JOHN H. BACON, a native of Niagara Co., graduated from the College of Physicians, New York; located in DeWitt, Clinton Co., in 1852. He moved to Lansing about 1860. (MHM)

DR. PETER H. BANTA was born in Oxford, Oakland Co., Aug. 19, 1874, and departed this life Nov. 26, 1915, aged 41 years, 3 months, 7 days. At the age of five years he came with his parents to Clinton Co., and settled near Hubbardston. From the district he entered the Hubbardston high school, afterward spending four years in the Detroit College of Medicine, from which he graduated in 1900. Dr. Banta practiced medicine in Westphalia 7 years, in Mancelona 2 years, and DeWitt 6 years. He leaves to mourn their loss, his wife, mother, three daughters, Lucile, Marian, and Dawn; three sisters, Mrs. Carrie Heilner of Detroit, Mrs. Mabel Adams of Port Huron, and Miss Lois Banta of DeWitt; three brothers, Andrew of Detroit, James W. of Port Huron, and Martin of Detroit. The funeral was held at the M.E. church Monday, Rev. T. H. Wright officiating. Rev. W. H. Thompson sang. Interment in DeWitt Cemetery. *Clinton Republican*; 2 Dec. 1915

DR. RUFUS D. BOSS, who had been at the beck and call of ill and suffering folk for the past 33 years, died early Monday morning, Dec. 4, 1933, at his home in Wacousta where he had practiced his profession as a physician and surgeon since 1900. He was a former president of the Clinton Co. Medical Society and a member of the Clinton Memorial Hospital staff. Funeral services were conducted at 2 p.m. Wed. at the Wacousta Methodist Church. Rev. F. O. Wright of Saranac and Rev. Bessie M. Rulison officiated. Burial was made in the Wacousta Cemetery. Dr. Boss was born in Clinton Co. in 1861. His parents, Ammi and Sarah Boss, came to Michigan from New York State in 1849 and settled in Riley Twp., later moving to Fowler where Mr. Boss bought an interest in a flouring mill. For a time Dr. Boss was a resident of Washington D. C., and was a member of the Masonic Lodge in that city. He began the practice of medicine 42 years ago. Surviving are two nephews, Leon and Carlton Boss of Watertown Twp., and a niece, Mrs. Henry Welton. Dr. Boss was well and favorably known throughout the county. *Clinton Co. Republican-News*; 7 Dec 1933

DR. EUGENE V. CHASE was born in Trumbull Co., Ohio, Sept. 6, 1833; was graduated from the medical department, University of Michigan, in 1856; practiced medicine in Ovid, then in Elsie. In 1861 he enlisted in the Clinton County Trails

1st Michigan Cavalry. He served through the Civil War, rising to the rank of first lieutenant. He was several time supervisor of Duplain and was chairman of the county board. He was a Republican in politics. (MHM)

DR. J. A. CULLINS, St. Johns osteopath, after practicing his profession for 39 years, has closed his office and plans to retire. About Oct. 1 he and Mrs. Cullins will leave this city on a extended vacation trip through the west and south. Dr. Cullins came to St. Johns from Ionia 27 years ago and was the first osteopath to locate permanently here. He opened offices in the St. Johns National Bank building, which he continued to occupy until his retirement. He first began his practice in Missouri and remained in that state several years before moving to Michigan. Mr. and Mrs. Cullins recently sold their residence property at 305 N. Swegles St., which they built a number of years ago. "Although we are leaving town for a long rest and may not return here permanently," said Dr. Cullins this week, "we will continue to call St. Johns our home." *Clinton Co. Republican-News*; 5 Sept. 1940

DR. L. W. FASQUELLE, St. Johns pioneer physician, died at his home in this village last Fri. night, after an illness of nearly a year, although he had been confined to his bed but a short time previous to his death. He was born in France Dec. 3, 1828, and when a child came with his father to Livingston Co., Michigan, where he lived upon a farm several years. His father was Prof. John Louis Fasquelle, of Michigan University, eminent in his day as a teacher and author of French textbooks for the schools. Dr. Fasquelle attended lectures at Bellevue Hospital, graduated in medicine at Michigan University, and came to St. Johns in 1855 when the embryo village contained but one frame house. He has been a continuous resident of St. Johns ever since with the exception of a few months' residence in Pontiac, eight months' service as surgeon in the 23rd Mich. Inf., and last winter spent in Kansas.

He stood high in his profession and was regarded as an exceptional, skillful surgeon. He leaves a widow; a son, L. J. Fasquelle of Petoskey; a brother, Dr. M. F. Fasquelle of Mt. Pleasant; and a sister, Miss Fannie Fasquelle of Ann Arbor. The funeral was held at his late residence on Mon. afternoon and was largely attended by the pioneers who had known him so long. Rev. W. C. Allen officiated and the Masonic Lodge took charge of the funeral and attended in a body. He was also a member of the Knights of Honor and ancient Order of United Workmen. *Clinton Republican*; 5 Dec, 1889

DR. STANTON E. HAZARD from Niagara Co, New York, attended one course of lectures in Ann Arbor and commenced practice in Wacousta, Clinton Co., in 1842. He was careful and cautious and uniformly successful. He died in 1880. (MHM)

DR. ISAAC F. HOLLISTER, who on a visit to his brother Joseph in 1847 was persuaded to remain in

Victor, Clinton Co., practiced there until 1864. He was a member of the state senate in 1856. (MHM)

DR. LEVI D. JENNISON, a native of Connecticut, came to Michigan in 1837 and located on the south side of Looking-Glass River, then known as New Albany. He moved to Essex, Clinton Co., in 1843, where he practiced until his death at 63 years of age (1863). He was slow of forming an opinion. In cases of inflammation of the lungs he was uniformly successful and without an equal in this region of county. (MHM)

DR. SOLON C. KING, an ardent Democrat (in 1880); in 1877 successful candidate for county clerk of Clinton Co.; after graduation at the University of Michigan in medicine, established himself at Ovid, then a mere hamlet, in 1860. He eventually formed a co-partnership with Samuel S. Moore in the drug and medicine business and relinquished practice or the less arduous labors of the store. (MHM)

DR. SETH P. MARVIN came from Oakland to Clinton Co. with his father in 1835. He built a log house in Watertown. Later he moved to DeWitt. He was not a medical graduate but was admitted to the Central Michigan Medical Society ...[with the] privilege of practicing Physic and Surgery in this State. He was successful as a physician and very popular with the people, a good conversationalist and storyteller. He died in 1864. (MHM)

DR. AARON MC KEE came to Victor, Clinton Co., about 1860 and practiced there until his death. (MHM)

DR. HIRAM RATHBUN came to Michigan in 1840. He entered the ministry when seventeen years of age, locating in Clinton Co. where he conducted services for the United Brethren Congregation. He traveled extensively as an evangelist. He was also a practicing physician and was well known all over Michigan in the earlier days. He was a strong Republican in politics and was one of the founders of that party at Jackson, afterward organizing 156 townships in this state. (MHM)

DR. DE WITT C. STEWART of Genesee Co., New York, came to Tecumseh in 1833 and engaged in real estate operations. Later he studied medicine in New York state and 1852 returned in Michigan. He practiced in Onondaga and Aurelius, Ingham Co., and after 1854 in St. Johns. He was the first permanent physician in the township and his ride extended for 25 and 30 miles over roads few and poor. He was one of the original members of the Clinton Co. Medical Society. (MHM)

DR. GEORGE W. TOPPING, died at his home in DeWitt, Clinton Co., Jan. 14, 1895, at the age of 67 years. He had been sick for several weeks, but it was thought he was getting better. The doctor died while sitting in his chair reading his mail matter. He rallied from his former illness which began last fall and had so far recovered as to be able to go to Lansing. He was born at Mentz, Cayuga Co., New York, and Dec. 11, 1828. He spent his boyhood days on a farm and attended the district

school; then went to Groton Academy and later studied in the Normal School of Albany where he was given a free scholarship. He taught school for some time and then entered the office of Dr. J. V. Griggs of Montezuma and commenced the study of medicine. Later he studied with his brother-in-law, Dr. W.S. Alaben, and took one term of lectures in the Wooster University of Cleveland, Ohio. He then went to California where he spent three years in mining, after which he returned to Lockport, New York, and took up to the study of Latin and German. In 1853 he entered the medical department of the University of Michigan, and in the spring of 1854 received his diploma and at once settled in DeWitt where he pursued the practice of his profession until his death. Dr. Topping was president of the State Medical Society in 1882, and was a Mason; a man highly esteemed by his profession as well as the laity. (MHM)

DR. WILLIAM B. WATSON emigrated to Michigan in 1839 and located in Duplain, Clinton Co., where he opened an office at the Rochester Colony. He was the first physician and for many years the only one in the township. He enjoyed the confidence of the people and the respect of his fellow practitioners. (MHM)

DR. A. J. WIGGINS died at his home in St. Johns at 1 o'clock last Sat. morning, of paralysis. He had been gradually failing for the past two years, but about two weeks ago suffered a stroke of paralysis from which he did not rally.

Andrew Jackson Wiggins was born in Rome, Oneida Co., New York, June 17, 1828, being 72 year and six days old at the time of his death. He passed his boyhood days on his father's farm, but at a very early age evinced a desire to study medicine. He studied with numerous physicians in New York, until he attained the age of 22 years at which time he came to this state and attended the medical department of the University of Michigan two years. In Aug. 1852 he returned to New York, entering the Geneva Medical College, from which institution he obtained his degree. He first practiced near Columbia City, IN; then at Goshen, remaining in the state four years. Thence he came to Michigan locating at Chelsea, Washtenaw Co., where he remained one year, afterwards practicing at Dansville, Ingham Co., from which place he came to St. Johns, locating here in 1861. In Aug. 1852, he married Miss Irene Betts of Blissfield, Lenawee Co., Michigan, who lived but a few years. In 1872 he married Miss Hattie Mead of this village who, with two children, Birdaline and George F., survive him. He is also survived by one brother, Dr. O. B. Wiggins of Lawrence, Michigan and Mrs. Holden T. Miller of Batavia, New York; both being unable to attend the funeral on account of poor health.

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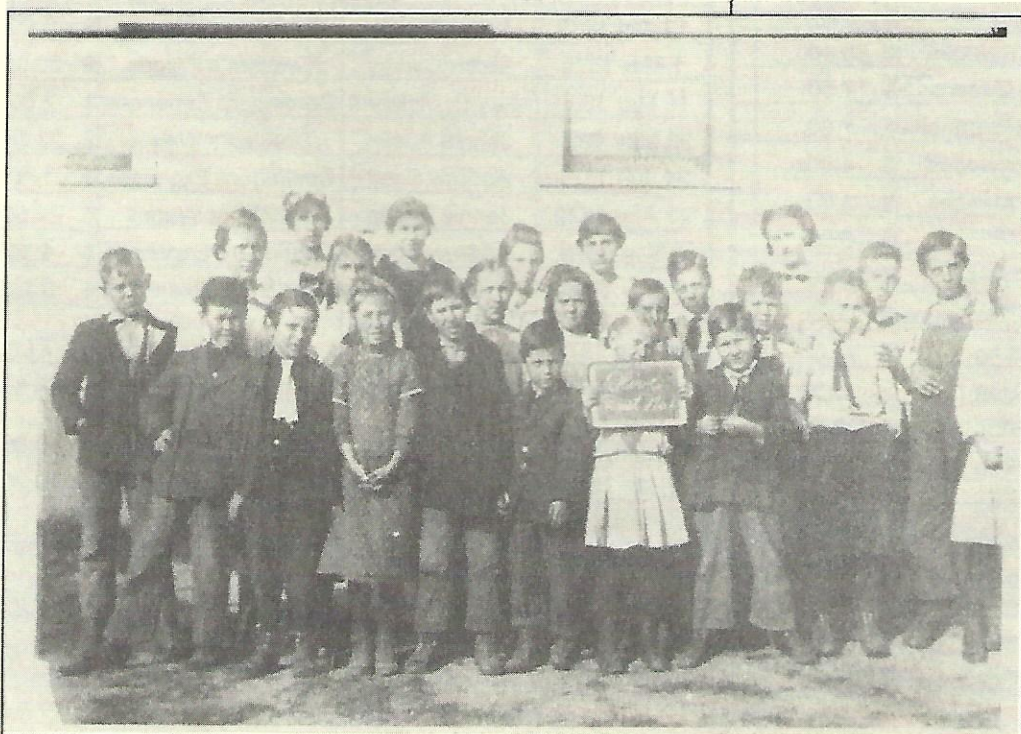

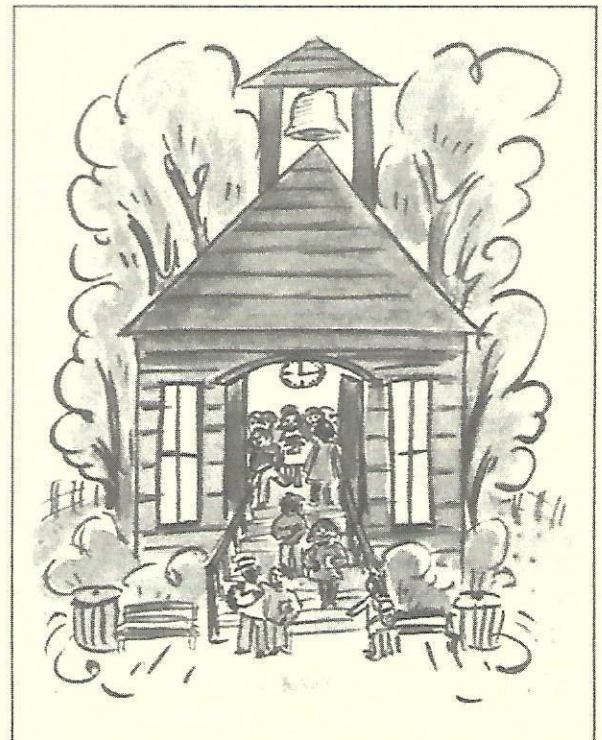

WATTS & ARAY FAMILIES

I recently visited your archive and found information about my gr-gr-gr-grandmother. I also viewed the pioneer records of **William H. and Harriet L. Watts**. I thought ... someone researching this family would be interested in the connection I have found between this couple and a family named Aray.

Eglon Aray, a nephew of William H. Watts, was also an early resident of St. Johns. He and his wife, **Alice (Hardy) Aray** both died young in the mid-1870's. They, and their infant daughter **Ina**, are buried in Mt. Rest Cemetery in St. Johns.

Eglon was the son of **Asher and Catherine (Watts) Aray** who were pioneer residents of Pittsfield Twp., Washtenaw Co., Michigan. The Ypsilanti Historical Society has preserved letters from William H. and Harriet L. Watts, in addition to a number of letters from Eglon and Alice. The Aray family was active in the Underground Railroad and a plaque remembering their contribution has been erected at their place of burial in Harwood Cemetery, Pittsfield.

Eglon Aray's wife, Alice Hardy, was the daughter of **William J. Hardy**. The latter is a person of interest in that he was the first African American to be elected to public office in Michigan. Eglon and Alice Aray were survived by one daughter, **Eva**, who, after the deaths of her parents, was reared in the William J. Hardy family in Gaines Twp., Kent Co., Michigan.
