



William Ferrier

1834–1913 [Contributed by Ray Lake]

William Ferrier was born 6 January 1834 in Starkey, Yates County, New York, son of John the and Martha Ferrier. He came to Michigan at an early age with his parents and Ypsilanti settled in in Washtenaw County.

William enlisted as a Private on 8 August 1862 in the 17th Michigan Infantry, Company E. This infantry was known as the celebrated "Stonewall Regiment of the Union" and participated in many of the sharpest engagements at the battle of South Mountain, Knoxville, Lebanon, Columbia, the Siege of Fort Saunders, including the pursuit of General Lee. He was mustered out on 3 July 1865 at Delaney House in Washington, D.C.


At the close of the war, he returned to Michigan and settled in St. Johns where he was a carpenter by trade and worked steadily to the time of his death in 1913.


This granite marker was installed on 23 July 2008 in the old section No. 3 in Mount Rest Cemetery, St. Johns, Michigan by members of the George W. Anderson Camp No. 54 of the Sons of Union Veterans, S.V.C. Doug Armstrong, Tom Emerick, Dennis Felton, Dick Williams and L. Ray Lake commemorating William Ferrier on his service during the Civil War. A dedication is being planned at a later date for his descendants.


MAIL ROUTE BETWEEN GEARY AND SHEPARDSVILLE



Court cases of Philander Howe continued from Cl. Co. Trails Vol 23, No. 1.

State of Michigan Clinton County

John LaBaron Vs Cornelius Waters In Justice Court Philander Howe Justice of the Peace

12th case of Philander's journal

February 3, 1863 – Summons issued returnable February 12^{th} 1863 at 12 O clock noon personally served by Henry Howe, Constable, fees .47.

February 12th parties appeared in their own proper person and joined issues.

Plaintiff declares in assumes set and in account and moneys had labor done or anything else to Plaintiffs damage one hundred dollars or under.

Defendant pleads the general issue and gives notice of an off set and demands a Juror Trial on motion of Defendant cause adjourned to the 7^{th} day of March 1863 at 1 O'clock P.M.

March 7th 1863 parties appeared according to adjournment.

There came a Juror to wit Augustus Gillett, Robbert Yongs, Joseph Tiffin, Arzuel R. Owen, Charles M. Rockwell and Lewis Smith being duly sworn took their seat to try said case.

Alonzo LeBaron sworn for plaintiff is acquainted with the parties knows the parties had deal with each other recollects plaintiff letting defendant have a calf worked one day for defendant in hay worked ½ day with team thrashing worked ½ day at another time with team thrashing. Defendant had plaintiff gram cradle heard plaintiff turn and witness ½ day thrashing. Witness recollects plaintiff let defendants have some paint and a horse to ride ten mile.

Alonzo Le Baron cross examined says the work was done by way of changing work thinks there ½ pint of paint.

John L. LeBaron, Plaintiff sworn says defendant called on him and wanted \$2.00 in money witch he let him have all so let him have 9 shillings at another time.

Plaintiff cross examined says defendant wanted two dollars in money understood that Hiram Hand was

owing defendant money wanted it on Hands account let defendant have \$2.00 let defendant have \$2.00 let defendant have 9 shillings thinks it was in August 1859 or 60.

Joseph H. Tiffin sworn for plaintiff never heard defendant say anything concerning this deal with plaintiff only the defendant bout a calf of plaintiff thinks defendant was to pay plaintiff \$3 or \$3.50 for calf Thinks he has paid fifty cents per day for us of cutter .75 for team per day thinks it is worth fifty cents for the use of a horse per day wont know but a grain cradle is worth one shilling per day, tallows worth 10 per lb

Augustus Gillett sworn for plaintiff thinks paint is work 3 shillings per quart settled at 12 for paint, thinks is worth five shillings for a days work in Oct.

Plaintiff rested case.

Cornelius Watters, defendant sworn for defendant has been acquainted with plaintiff 8 years went to plaintiff to get money on the account of Hiram Hand did not get any money of plaintiffs never the \$2.00 spoken of by plaintiff never the 9 shillings spokin of by or sworn to by plaintiff, plaintiff s Son wanted. Defendant to help stack wheat and oats Defendant, Helped stack wheat and oats and plaintiffs son Alonzo helped Defendant in hay defendant worked 3 days in haying our gathering oats thinks it is worth 10 shillings per day on day at six shillings 2 ½ days husking corn at five shillings per day let plaintiff have one dollars worth of corn?

Defendant rested cause

Plaintiff took his case again by rebutting

Plaintiff recalled says the work done by defendant was to pay for calf

Defendant was to give four days work for the calf

Cause then rested finally by booth parties Henry Howe Constable was then sworn and took charge of Jury. Jury agreed and came into court parties of suit called and being present. Jury then answered to their names and declared a verdict in favor of the defendant for two dollars and twenty-seven cents.

Whereupon Judgment was rendered against the plaintiff John LeBaron for the sum of two dollars and twenty-seven cents beside costs of suit in my present in open court this 7^{th} day of March AD 1863
